Pirate Hat

Materials

- Black construction paper
- ½ red construction paper
- White construction paper strips 1.7 x 11in
- Pirate hat pattern
- Glue, Tape, or Staples
- Scissors

Instructions

- 1. Cut along the solid black line on the pattern.
- 2. Trace the shape of the hat onto the one piece of the black construction paper.
- 3. Take the second piece of black construction paper and trace the back side of the template.
- 4. Cut out both sides of your pirate hat.
- 5. Tape, Glue, or Staple the two sides together. You should now have the front of your hat.
- 6. Now take your ½ sheet of red construction paper and fold it in half, hotdog style.
- 7. Cut along the dotted line on the pattern and trace it onto the red construction paper.
- 8. Cut the skull and crossbones out. Be sure not to cut along the fold.
- 9. Using glue or tape, attach the red skull and crossbones on to the black hat.
- 10. Using glue, staples, or tape, attach one end of the white construction paper strip to one bottom corner of the black construction paper hat. Bring the other end of the strip around to make a loop the size of your head, and attach it to the other bottom corner of the black construction paper hat.
- 11. If you used glue, wait for the glue to dry. Then put on your pirate hat and say "ARRRRGH!"



Pirate Hook

Materials

- 1 Hook Pattern
- ½ Red Construction Paper
- ½ White construction paper
- Glue or staples
- Scissors

Instructions

- 1. Create a funnel shape with the half piece of red construction paper. Use glue or staples to secure the shape.
- 2. Cut a hook shape out of white construction paper using the hook pattern.
- 3. Attach the hook to the cone with glue or staples.
- 4. Point your hook at someone and tell them to walk the plank!

Parrot

Materials

- Green Tissue Paper
- Small Square of Orange Construction Paper 1in x 1in
- Googly eyes
- Colorful feathers
- Glue
- Tape
- One toilet paper roll OR ½ paper towel roll
- Scissors

Instructions

- 1. Cover the outside of the toilet paper roll with the colored tissue paper. Tuck the ends of the tissue paper inside the toilet paper roll and secure it with tape or glue
- 2. Cut the orange construction paper into a small diamond shape, then fold the diamond in half and glue it to the front of the toilet paper roll. This is your parrot's beak.
- 3. Glue the two googly eyes above the beak.
- 4. Glue feathers to the sides of the toilet paper roll to make your parrot's wings.
- 5. Glue one extra feather to the top of your parrot to make a plume.
- 6. Give your parrot a name and put it on your shoulder!
